Lenten Opportunities

During Lent there will be two great options on Tuesday nights to engage the season as we prepare for East-

er. If not one of these options, I encourage you to find a way to slow down and act in more intentional ways. Consider how you speak to each other and strangers, how you spend your time and energy, and the ways in which your resources and responsibilities often control your lives more than they should.

Remembering 400 - Tuesdays at 6:00pm (3/10-3/31)

The first is a short series called *Remembering 400* (2020 is the 400th vear of Congregationalism in North America). This discussion series will focus on four aspects of early Congregational history. The first will look at how the early Congregationalists thought about themselves as the Body in Christ. The second will consider the central place of importance the Bible held in their lives and community. The third will reflect on their connection to European colonization and their relationships with the Wampanoag people and other Native


American communities. The fourth will draw a connection between what it meant to them to be Congregationalists and what we can learn about being Congregationalists today. This will not be a history lecture! There will be different types of resources to help our discussion. Hopefully there will be something of interest for just about everyone to take with them.

The series of Roots of Joy is quite a bit different than what we have done so far. There is less of everything. This series will focus on the different ways we interact with and our impact on the world around us. We start with a gathering prayer, then share a communal prayer. After that people are invited to move around the sanctuary during the mix of silence and reading creative stories about animals and how they move and interact with their world. Silence, stories, warm lighting, and light music flow in and out of the service. It is a very relaxing hour spent in the quiet of the sanctuary.

March has arrived with its gift of snow. Saint Patrick's Day will be here on the 17th, and as you know Lent started Sunday.


Lent is the 40 days from Ash Wednesday to the Saturday before Easter. Lent is often described as a time of preparation and a time for personal reflection of our hearts and minds for Good Friday and Easter. We think of it as a time to give something up, but maybe we need to think of doing something good for others. This is a way to respond to God's grace, generosity and love. For example, spend time volunteering or donate money that you would normally use to buy something for yourself, like that

special morning coffee. Spending time during Lent praying, fasting and giving can make Jesus' sacrifice on Good Friday and his resurrection on Easter even more meaningful.

On the 8th of March the clocks change. They spring up, so be sure to be at church on time.

We still have small jobs that we need volunteers for at church. Many are one time jobs. So just ask what you can do.

Your Crucial Role in Our Church

As Congregationalists, we have a role in governance that is unlike most other faith communities. especially mainline Christian congregations. No other people or bodies make our decisions for us: how to spend our money, our administrative structure, even who we invite to serve as our Senior Minister. We try to make most of our decisions by consensus, but because we are a legal entity, we do have to hold formal votes. Since we have created an organization that includes electing representatives to our various positions and ministries, one such vote is coming up at the Spring Semi-annual Congregational Meeting on Sunday, April 19, 2020, immediately after the worship service.

You will receive Moderator Louise Smith's Call to Meeting letter in a Daily Update soon. Be sure to mark your calendar and plan to attend the Meeting. If you won't be able to attend, you can fill out a proxy form that's available on the Narthex table. You can also contact Krystal to request a form.

To me, this quote from Sharon Salzberg expresses why I believe your vote at the April 19th meeting will be so important: "Voting is like alchemy – taking an abstract value and breathing life into it." As participants in the First Congregational Christian Church of Anchorage, we breathe life into a vision of a faith community that is based on our covenant with each other and with a commitment to living our lives guided by Jesus' teachings. So, I hope you'll make vour brunch reservation for a bit later on April 19th, and stay to join with other alchemists as we vote our values.
